

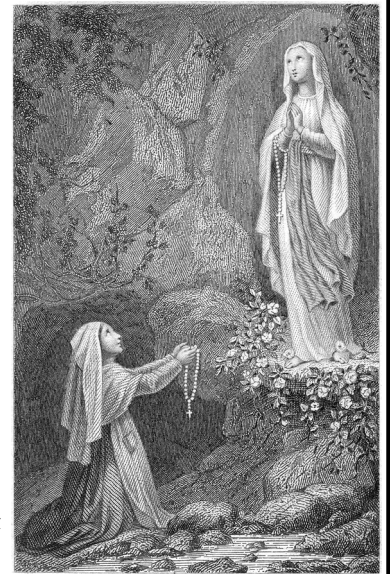

THE ALLOTMENT OF SUFFRAGES IN PURGATORY

EVERY THING DONE to help any of the holy souls brings some sort of relief to the soul for whom it is offered. But the amount of relief we do not know; it depends on the will of God and the merits of the individual. A Mass offered for one person may deliver him altogether; for another it may have the effect merely of a drop of water to cool his tongue in the burning flames, or of a breath of cool air amid the furnace of fire. *On our life NOW will depend our speedy relief and deliverance from Purgatory, still more than on the prayers offered for us then.*

The very prayers and Masses that will avail us will be in great measure the result of what we do NOW to please God. If we help others now, we shall then have many to help us; if we give alms liberally, God will take care that we receive spiritual alms. A rich man who has been stingy during life, but leaves a large sum of money for Masses to be said for him, will indeed derive some benefit from them, but it may be that God will transfer the great proportion of the satisfaction to some poor man who has been generous and charitable to others during life. The rich man may wait for long years, and the poor man who had no money to leave, may be delivered at once. *Learn then to be generous NOW.*

The satisfactory value of every Mass, though it is in itself infinite, is not infinite as applied to the individual. It is limited by the will of God and the dispositions of man. God looks upon the merits of His Son and accepts them for that soul in proportion to

- † The League of St Martin meets the 2nd Saturday of the month at 1:00 pm to make reparation to The Holy Face.
- † You can still gain a plenary indulgence by **visiting a cemetery each day for the first eight days of November, praying for the faithful departed.** These indulgences are applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory. Here is the traditional invocation for the dead: *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.*

A plenary indulgence may be gained by each member of the faithful who, renouncing any personal attachment to sin, even venial sin, and desiring to obtain the indulgence, (i) completes the indulged action in a state of grace; (ii) makes a complete and integral sacramental confession within eight days; (iii) participates at Mass and receives Holy Communion on the same day work is performed if seeking plenary indulgence; and (iv) offers one *Our Father* and one *Hail Mary* for the intentions of the Holy Father (i.e., (a) the exaltation of the Church; (b) the uprooting of heresies; (c) peace among Christian nations; (d) the propagation of the faith; and (e) conversion of sinners).

“Time flies irrevocably, brethren, and while you think you are avoiding this minimal punishment, you incur a fuller one, for know this, that after this life whatever was neglected here will be repaid a hundred-fold in Purgatory, even to the last farthing. I know how hard it is for a man of dissolute life to take up discipline, for talkative man to endure silence, for a man accustomed to wandering to remain in one place, but it will be harder and much harder to bear the discomforts to come” —St. Bernard of Clairvaux.

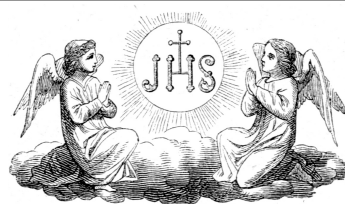


“In our time more than ever before, the chief strength of the wicked, lies in the cowardice and weakness of good men... All the strength of Satan’s reign is due to the easy-going weakness of Catholics. Oh! if I might ask the Divine Redeemer, as the prophet Zachary did in spirit: What are those wounds in the midst of Thy hands? The answer would not be doubtful: With these was I wounded in the house of them that loved Me. I was wounded by My friends, who did nothing to defend Me, and who, on every occasion, made themselves the accomplices of My adversaries.
