EAR PARISHIONERS, Praised be Jesus Christ! There was an article on the

website Rorate Caeli the other day about an interesting pattern that has seemingly developed over the Traditional Latin Mass being approved or denied in dioceses. They note that "in the Archdiocese of Baltimore and Diocese of Richmond, no diocesan clergy at diocesan parishes" can offer the Traditional Latin Mass licitly. In those dioceses, however, they have the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, with personal parishes. Now, here is the interesting part that would be beneficial for us. In the dioceses of San Antonio and Arlington, there is no Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, or any other TLM personal parishes. Those dioceses "have been granted two-year indult renewals, this week, for their existing diocesan parish TLMs offered by diocesan priests". Rorate Caeli notes a possible pattern. If true, we would be safe here since we are a personal parish and the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter, or any other group or personal parish, exists in the Diocese of Covington for the Traditional Latin Mass. Let's pray that this is true! I can imagine the anxiety and worry that has come about with the supposed "third document" on the TLM being restricted. Let's continue to storm heaven that the Mass of the Ages, remains for all those who want to worship our beloved Lord as the Saints of old. And friends, there are many! It was quite encouraging to see the attendance at the TLM for the Eucharistic Congress this past week. The Church was so full that they had to turn away people. 
