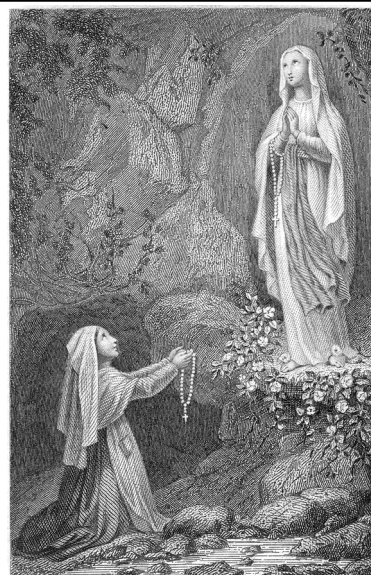

On this Sunday's Gospel by Ven. Louis of Granada



IN THE RETURN FROM JERUSALEM, Mary discovered that Jesus was not with the caravan, and after having searched for Him in vain among relatives and friends, she returned once again with Joseph to Jerusalem. There they searched throughout all the city, in all its streets and squares, asking everyone they met if they had seen the Child, but no one could give an answer to their question. Three days and three nights passed in this way, during which time the holy Virgin neither slept nor rested, seeing that she had lost her treasure. Since so much of her life since the birth of Christ had been spent in flights, now that she saw that the Child was lost, her fears and sorrows were very great. The reason is evident. Sorrow is based on love, and when one's love is stronger, so also are the effects and movements of love. And who can explain the greatness of Mary's love for her Son? ... It was the greatest love that a simple creature could ever have. And she who had so great a love for her Son, must have experienced great happiness to have Him ever at her side, to see Him seated each day at the family table, to hear His voice, to enjoy His company, and to see the majestic bearing which already shone forth in His small body. How often the Blessed Mother must have sat at table without eating but just watching Him who sustains the angels. How often she must have spent most of the night on her knees at the crib of the divine Infant, seeing Him sleep who watches over the world... And if Mary's love was so immense, what must have been her sorrow at the loss of the object of her love? Three days were given to Abraham to prepare for the sacrifice of his

son and to suffer by anticipation the loss of his son through death. Three days were given to Mary to suffer the loss of her Son. O Lord, Thou dost afflict those who love Thee! How careful Thou art to give them matter for merit and the crown, offering them so many occasions to suffer, to pray, to hope, to be humbled, and to hasten to Thee in their needs! When God desired to put an end to this martyrdom of the Blessed Virgin, He ordained that she should find her Son in His proper place, which is the temple and house of God. This is what generally happens – we find a thing in its proper place; and since the temple is the place of God, it is reasonable that one should look for and find Jesus there. The temple is a house of prayer, and there certainly is where God is to be found. Therefore when you find yourself sad, disconsolate, distracted, or without a spark of devotion, enter into this temple and persevere in prayer. If you are faithful, you will find God and the indication that you have Him will be the devotion and strength and interior joy that you will receive... When the Bl Mother found her Son, the Evangelist tells us that she asked Him: "Son, why hast Thou done this? Behold, Thy father and I sought Thee, sorrowing." Her Son answered: "Why have you sought Me? Did you not know that I must be about My Father's business?" This seems a harsh reply for a son to give to his mother, but Jesus here gives us an example of how we ought to act toward our parents if they become an impediment to the things of God, although in all things else they are to be respected and obeyed. The same Lord who taught us the one thing, teaches us the other, for the Evangelist says later that Jesus went with them to Nazareth & was subject to them.
