

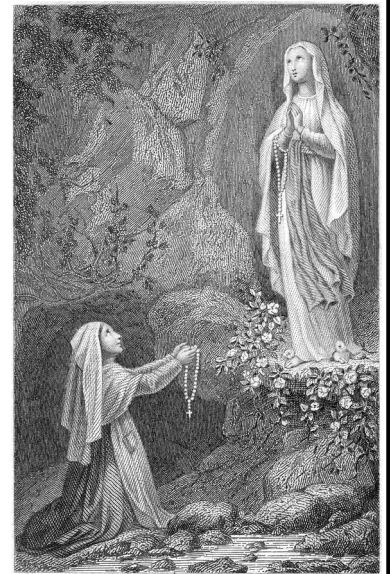

IT IS AN HISTORICAL FACT that St. Simon Stock received the Brown Scapular directly from Our Lady's hands. On July 16, 1251, Simon Stock complained to Blessed Mary of the persecutions waged against his Carmelite order, which seemed to be on the point of falling apart. With tears he begged her not to forsake a religious family which she had taken under her protection. The Most Holy Virgin then appeared to Simon, presenting him with a brown scapular, saying: *My son, receive this scapular as a sign of the privilege which I have obtained for thee and for the children of Carmel. Whosoever shall die invested with this habit shall be preserved from the fire of hell. It is a sign of salvation, a safeguard against peril, the special pledge of peace and protection.* The saint, full of joy, showed the precious gift he had received, not only for the Carmelite Order, but also for the whole Christian world. By wearing the Scapular of our Lady of Mt. Carmel, we are clothed with Mary's garment. And thanks to our little brown habit, wherever we are, whatever we are doing, the Blessed Virgin Mary never sees us without seeing upon our bodies evidence of our devotion to her. Always and everywhere our scapulars plead for our protection and salvation, while also telling her that we love her. But know that if we generously offer Our Lady public and continual homage through the Brown Scapular, she will never be outdone in generosity, but will guarantee us protection and salvation. She will protect us in danger. She will help us to die well. She will quickly and powerfully help us even after death if we dwell in Purgatory. If Mary protects us, whom shall we fear? If Our Lady crushed the head of Satan himself, then
